Electric Generation Supplier License Cancellations of
Companies with an Expired Financial Security

FINAL ORDER

On May 21, 2026, a Tentative Order was entered in the above captioned proceeding.

The Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code §54.42(a) require that a licensee shall comply with the applicable requirements of the code and Commission regulations and orders. Consistent with due process, a license may be suspended or revoked, and fines may be imposed against the licensee for failure to furnish and maintain a bond or other security approved by the Commission in the amount directed by the Commission.

The Electric Generation Suppliers (EGS) listed in the Table below filed an approved financial security within 30 days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The Tentative Order has become Final by operation of law. The Electric Generation Supplier License held by the company listed in Table 2 – EGS License Cancellation is cancelled and shall be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission’s Bureau of Technical Utility Services, removed from the Commission’s website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Supplier is licensed to do business. If the cancelled EGS licensee or any successors, applies in the future to provide electric generation supplier or natural gas supplier services in Pennsylvania, in any capacity, it must acknowledge this license revocation and provide information on the business controls it has in place to ensure compliance with the Code and the Commission’s orders and regulations.
