Re: Periodic Review of the Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority's Wastewater
Long- Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan

Dear Deanne M. O'Dell,

The Commission is required to review a utility's Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIP) periodically, but at least once every five (5) years.¹ Unless otherwise directed, the review shall begin at the midpoint of the term of the current LTIIP. Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority's (PWSA's) current LTIIP for its wastewater operations began with calendar year 2023 and thus the midpoint is approximately July 1, 2026.

PWSA is hereby notified that the Commission will begin the review of its LTIIP on August 17, 2026, at the above captioned docket number. The Commission's review will determine:

1. If PWSA has adhered to its LTIIP
2. If changes to the LTIIP are necessary to maintain and improve the efficiency, safety, adequacy and reliability of PWSA's existing distribution infrastructure.

Upon completion of the review, the Commission shall issue an Order with a determination of whether or not PWSA has adhered to its LTIIP and if any changes to the LTIIP are necessary. The Commission will direct PWSA to revise, update, or resubmit its LTIIP as appropriate if it determines PWSA's approved LTIIP is no longer adequate to ensure and maintain efficient, adequate, safe, reliable and reasonable service. Upon such a determination, PWSA may elect to withdraw its LTIIP rather than comply with the Commission's direction. PWSA's approved distribution system improvement surcharge (DSIC) mechanism would immediately terminate upon such a withdrawal.

To aid in its review the Commission is establishing a thirty (30) day comment period beginning from the date of this letter and a twenty (20) day reply comment period.² A copy of this letter has been served upon the statutory advocates, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, and the parties of record from PWSA's most recent base rate case proceeding, consistent with the LTIIP

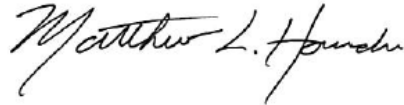
